

Danbury Hackerspace Membership Agreement



Introduction

Welcome to The Danbury Hackerspace. This document serves as the agreement that a member of Danbury Hackerspace has with The Danbury Hackerspace.

As a member you are entitled to the following:

- 24/7 access to the Hackerspace to work on projects.
- Use of all the community tools and equipment. Access to the shop area requires the member to pass a shop safety and usage class.
- Free or discounted access to all workshops and events.
- Area to store ongoing projects.
- Use of all public parts and supplies.
- Use of our high-speed network connection.
- Work on any Hackerspace project that interests you.

Rules

- Be respectful of others.
- Respect everyone's projects.
- Do not use tools, parts, or food labeled as "Private" or "Personal" by other members.
- Respect others intellectual property (in other words, don't steal their name, ideas, content or marks).
- No member is allowed to bring non-members into the Danbury Hackerspace except on open house nights or other events open to the public without approval of Hackerspace Staff.
- No member is allowed to let non-shop certified people into the shop area.
- No member is allowed to threaten or physically touch another member in a threatening or violent manner.
- No consuming of alcoholic beverages on the premises.

Intellectual Property

Danbury Hackerspace makes no claim to any intellectual property created by Danbury Hackerspace members or created using Danbury Hackerspace facilities. Members should inform other members working on a collaborative project that the project is not licensed under the Open Source Initiative or the Creative Commons license.

Membership Submission Process

- Download and fill out this application (Membership is restricted to adults 18 years and above)
- Bring the document along with a valid drivers license or other legal ID (to verify age) to our weekly meeting.
- The Hackerspace membership committee person will accept application for review.
- A background check may be conducted to validate the membership agreements.
- You will be notified of acceptance or rejection via email. If you are accepted then the email will contain times when you can stop by and pick up your membership packet and key.
- Payment will be due when you pick up your badge and key. Payments can be made with cash, check, or major credit cards.

Membership Dues

Dues are to be paid (received) on the monthly anniversary of your membership date. If dues are not received by 7 days after your monthly anniversary then your membership will be restricted. Restricted access allows you to only use the space during public access. If the dues are not received by the 1st of the next month your membership is placed on hold, you must forfeit your access card. Membership can be re-instated by bringing your dues current. If payment is not received in 6 months your membership is terminated. This means that you must re-apply for membership.

Full	\$50.00 month
Household	\$50.00 month and \$25 for each additional member
Student	\$25.00 month

Single Members have 24/7 access to the space and resources. Note full access to the shop equipment is only granted to members that complete a shop safety class and a test for each piece of equipment in the shop.

Student memberships require a valid student ID from a school, college or university.

Membership Termination

Membership can be terminated by Danbury Hackerspace for any of the following reasons:

- Lying on the membership application.
- Stealing anything from the space.
- Stealing intellectual property from another member.
- Letting non-authorized personnel into the space or shop area.
- Lack of payment.
- Fighting or physical / mental abuse of any person on Danbury Hackerspace property or at any Danbury Hackerspace event.
- Violation of the Internet usage policy. *Note: Internet access at the Hackerspace is monitored by The State of Connecticut.*
- Use of the Danbury Hackerspace facility or any of its tools or computer network for illicit or illegal purposes.
- Copyright violations including but not limited to downloading of copyrighted materials.

Parking

Parking is available at the following locations: The Danbury Hackerspace lot and Library parking lot when the Danbury Public Library is closed, Main and Bank Street metered spots, and at the Danbury Patriot and Bardo Garages, located approximately two blocks from the Innovation Center. Monthly parking passes for the two garages are available from the City of Danbury for \$45.
